

Beyond his firefighting career, Matt teaches



Brig. Gen. R.J. Garcia, a San Antonio native and Clark High School graduate, has deep roots in the Northside Independent School District. An Eagle Scout and studentathlete, he was appointed to the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1992, graduating in 1996 and commissioning into the Aviation Branch. His extensive military career includes service in multiple divisions across the U.S. and overseas, holding key leadership roles in aviation and human resources commands.

In addition to his military achievements, Brig. Gen. Garcia holds degrees from West

Point, Kansas State University, and the U.S. Army War College. A Senior Army Aviator, he has earned the Combat Action Badge, Air Assault Badge, and numerous commendations, including the Bronze Star and Air Medals for combat service in Iraq. Now serving as the 81st Commandant of Cadets at West Point, he is married to Elizabeth Trevino, and they are proud parents of Grant and Ella.



Walter Ball has dedicated over two decades to fire science and emergency medicine, recently being named Assistant Chief of Operations and Training for the Boerne Fire Department. A 2001 O'Connor High School graduate, his commitment to service began early as an Eagle Scout and member of the Youth Orchestra of San Antonio. His interest in emergency medicine was sparked while working as a student aide for athletic trainers, leading him to become a paramedic and volunteer firefighter.

Walter holds a bachelor's in Fire and Emergency Services Administration

from Texas A&M University-San Antonio and has earned multiple commendations, including Paramedic of the Year and Chief of the Year. Beyond his fire department duties, he mentors students, presents at career days, and serves on the Texas Emergency Medical Task Force. He and his wife Rebecca, married for 17 years, are proud parents of Madisyn and Avonlea, both Northside ISD students.



Brandon Larson's baseball journey has been filled with highs and lows, but the lessons he learned extended far beyond the game. A standout athlete at Holmes High School, he excelled in both baseball and football while serving as senior class vice president and a National Honor Society member. After a brief stint at Blinn College, he transferred to LSU, where he led the Tigers to the College World Series with an impressive 40 home runs and 118 RBIs. Drafted 14th overall by the Cincinnati Reds in 1997, he found success in the minor leagues, earning multiple accolades before making his Major League debut in 2001. His career continued

with stints in the Atlantic League before retiring and transitioning into coaching and scouting.

Beyond the field, Brandon's most profound lesson came from his youngest fans, realizing the impact he could have on a child's life through simple acts of kindness. This understanding of selflessness has shaped his post-playing career, leading him to his current role as head baseball coach at Jay High School, where he continues to inspire and mentor the next generation of athletes.

NEF Designated Funds and Grants

Reminding employees they do not have to be teachers to apply for grants, NEF seeks funds from all NISD faculty and staff during its Annual Giving Campaign and, in return, awards grants throughout the school year.

Grants are read and scored by a committee of NEF Board members, NISD administrators, and community and business volunteers. The NISD Grants & Recognitions Department provides training on how to apply for and win an NEF grant.

In addition, NISD is able to use NEF's tax-exempt status to apply for other grants that are not open to public school districts without NEF's 501 c-3 authority. Designated or restricted donations to NEF are designed to be exclusively donor-driven. In each, IRS rules limit the use of funds to the specific goals of the donor.

The Foundation has 28 designated funds. NEF applies interest earned to funds of \$10,000 or more commensurate with NEF's endowment performance.

Their guidance helped her excel academically, leading her to join the National Honor Society, Spanish Honor Society, and Mu Alpha Theta before graduating in the top 10% of her class in 1991. She went on to earn a Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting from The University of Texas at San Antonio and later a Master of Science in Applied Statistics from the University of the Incarnate Word.

In 2007, Lisa joined Northside ISD as an accountant, where she made the life-changing decision to donate a kidney to a coworker, believing their paths were meant to cross. Now a Senior Advanced Data Analyst at the Texas Organ Sharing Alliance, she is passionate about using her skills to support organ donation efforts. Additionally, as a longtime youth minister at St. George Maronite Catholic Church, she is dedicated to mentoring and uplifting young people, ensuring they feel valued and empowered to make a difference.



Kim Jefferies has dedicated over 25 years to the nonprofit sector, aligning her passion for service with her leadership skills. After beginning her career at Brighton Center in 2000, she became CEO in 2006, leading the organization through major expansions and increasing its reach to over 4,000 children with disabilities annually. Since 2021, she has served as CEO of Haven for Hope, expanding programs for vulnerable populations and securing additional state and federal funding. Under her leadership, Haven for Hope was named the 2023 Nonprofit of the Year by the San Antonio Business Journal.

Above all, she credits her children, Daniel and Madison, as her greatest motivation, inspiring her to always strive for excellence.
