## English III AP/Dual 2025 Summer Reading

The primary genre we focus on in this course is nonfiction over various topics, as this helps us generate ideas for writing and makes us well-read on multiple topics that will be called upon in a college course and on the AP exam in May.

- (2) Pick out/highlight lines from the text that are interesting in how they are written and/or meaning. In essence, these should be lines that speak to the audience and move them.
