At Northside ISD, we are committed to providing a safe, focused, and distraction-free learning environment for every student.

The **Texas E-Cigarette and Tobacco Awareness Program REFERRAL Course** is designed for individuals under the age of 21 who are cited for possession of tobacco products, including vapes. This course will provide these individuals with the information and skills necessary to quit and avoid tobacco products in the future. This course should take 3-4 hours to complete and does not have to be completed all at one time.
