



March Guidance Counseling

During our month of March our guidance lessons are geared toward anxiety and worries. Specifically in 3rd-5th grade, we are teaching students what test anxiety means, test preparation skills, changing negative thinking patterns, and coping strategies to help them with any concerns they may be having.

In our younger grades, students are learning about what a worry means, through a read aloud and activities.

They will also be learning about impulse control through challenging games that encourage them to focus and listen to specific tasks.







Past Cuppa' Counselors: I am so "LUCKY" to have you!
